PASTOR'S REFLECTION

The parable of the Good Samaritan is one of the more popular parables of the Lord. It does not use more words but more actions. The Samaritan must have been a very good man. Without any hesitation, the Samaritan does everything expected from a good man. As he saw the bloodied person on the roadside, he was moved with compassion for the suffering fellow human being. He provided effective needed assistance to the victim. He brought him to an inn and personally took care of the

man. He even gave money to the innkeeper and promised to pay if it is not enough. He took full responsibility for the victim.

Jesus concludes his parable, "Go and do likewise." This is a command of the Lord is not in the abstract but one which shows us a pattern of life. It is not a request. It is imperative in the life of a Christian. For Jesus, love is to do good to others. It is not a sweet feeling that does not change anything about the situation. HISPANIC COMMUNITY
Domingo 13 de Julio del 2025.
(Semana XV del tiempo ordinario).

Hermanas y hermanos, las lecturas de hoy nos invitan a poner orden en el corazón y en la vida. Se trata de descubrir o redescubrir qué va primero y a qué debemos darle mayor atención y cuidado. Con lo cual también encontramos un canal para dar cauce a nuestras fuerzas y un camino para alcanzar lo que deseamos ser.

Una mente dispersa o un corazón dividido no acertarán con la meta. Una voluntad inconstante deshará hoy lo que hizo ayer y empezará mañana lo que hoy dejó atrás. ¿Tiene algo de extraño que la vida se pase de manera estéril y vacía para quien vive de tal manera? La única respuesta es: orden. Necesitamos darle orden a nuestro tiempo, esfuerzos, deseos, proyectos.

El orden del que aquí hablamos no es una imposición exterior. No es algo lejano que cae sobre nosotros como un simple agregado. Moisés nos dice en la primera lectura de hoy: "todos mis mandamientos están muy a tu alcance: en tu boca y en tu corazón, para que puedas cumplirlos."

Podemos decir que la ley del Señor brota de lo que somos: de hecho, él mismo la ha puesto en nosotros,

y podemos sentir su imperativo si hacemos silencio y buscamos con total honestidad escuchar eso que llamamos la voz de la conciencia. Una ley así entendida es un camino de libertad, cuya única obligación es la fidelidad a lo mejor de lo que hay en nosotros, y que viene de Dios.

Dios, pues, quiere reinar no sólo externamente, como decir en las obras que hacemos, sino sobre todo, interiormente: en el "corazón," según la terminología común de la Biblia. Hay que aclarar que este "corazón" no es solamente lugar de los sentimientos, como suele decirse y entenderse en nuestra cultura. En el corazón se toman decisiones, se hacen proyectos, se recuerdan y meditan los hechos, se busca el sentido de las palabras. En la medida en que Dios toma el primer lugar en el corazón todo nuestro ser adquiere orden, sentido y belleza en él. Si nos ordena que le amemos no es por una deficiencia suya sino por amor a nuestro bien, que sólo puede ser alcanzado amándole a él en primer lugar.

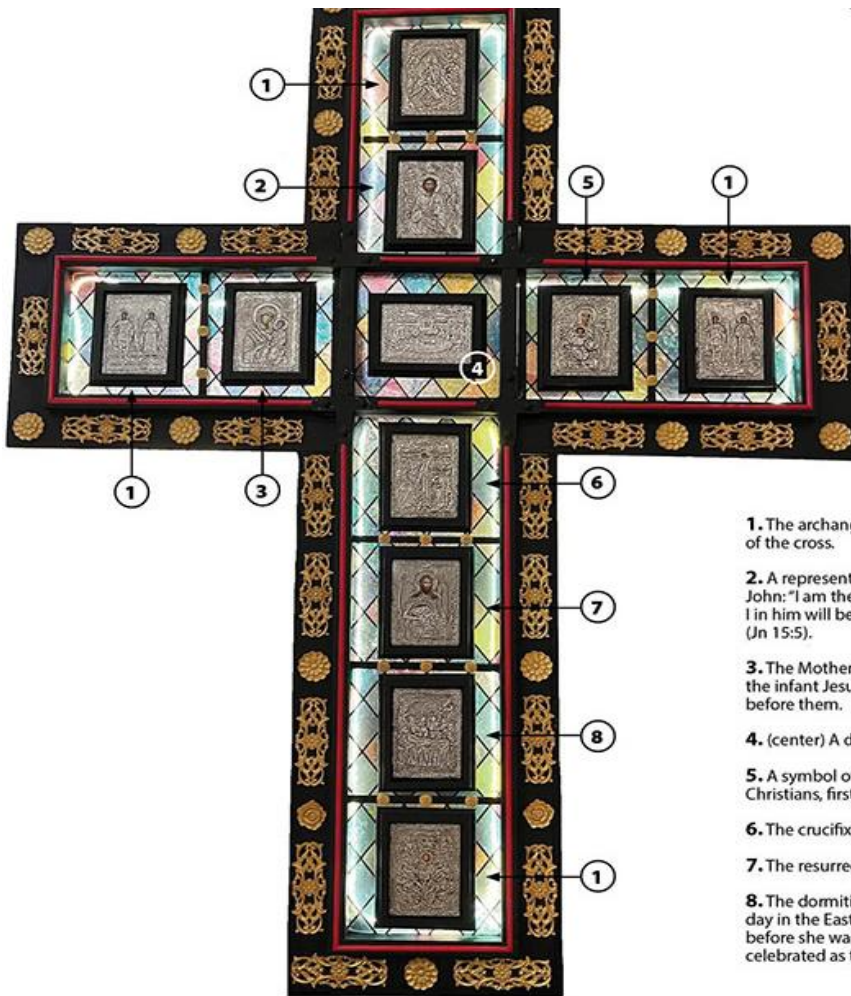

The Diocese of Honolulu's Jubilee cross is hard to miss.

Whether isle faithful see the cross at its main post in the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa in Honolulu, or its traveling twin (lately stationed at the Cathedral Basilica of Our Lady of Peace in downtown Honolulu), a number of features will catch their eye: its height (more than 8 feet tall), the striking black-and-gold color scheme, the stained glass that sets off each of its 11 intricate icons.

Jubilee crosses in churches throughout the world offer a way for people to connect to Pope Francis and to Holy Year events in Rome as they gather and pray around them, according to Father Alfred Omar B. Guerrero, director of the diocesan Office of Worship.

Father Manny Hewe, pastor of the co-cathedral, provided an explanation of the icons on Hawaii's Jubilee cross, which was created by the co-cathedral's Deacon Ray Lamb.

1. The archangels St. Michael and St. Gabriel are depicted at each end of the cross.

2. A representation of Jesus as the vine, as stated in the Gospel of John: "I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit because, without me, you can do nothing" (Jn 15:5).

3. The Mother of Perpetual Help — the Blessed Virgin Mary holding the infant Jesus, with archangels St. Michael and St. Gabriel standing before them.

4. (center) A depiction of the Last Supper.

5. A symbol of the enduring Marian devotion of Mary, Help of Christians, first coined by St. John Chrysostom in 345 AD.

6. The crucifixion and death of Jesus.

7. The resurrection of the Lord.

8. The dormition, or "falling asleep," of Mary, observed as a feast day in the Eastern Orthodox tradition to commemorate her repose before she was taken up to heaven. In the Latin Catholic tradition, it is celebrated as the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Aug. 15.
