PASTOR’S REFLECTION



When Jesus asked the two disciples on their way to Emmaus, “What matters are you discussing?” they stopped short, their faces downcast. They failed to recognize Jesus. Sadness, gloom, self-pity and a sense of their personal doom prevented them from recognizing their Master. To avoid having to face another tragedy like that of Calvary, they were fleeing from Jerusalem. Enveloped in despair they could not see their risen Lord. Like these disciples we have some Christians who never recognize Christ. When they are engrossed in their own tragedies and cannot see a solution for their problems, they erroneously conclude that God is dead.

But the Risen Lord is very much with us, only, we never invite Him to stay with us. We see clearly in the Gospel that the two disciples invited Jesus to stay with them. Let us open our hearts and invite Him to enter into our life. The disciples recognize Him in the breaking of the bread. They recognized Him not in the bread, but in an activity, in behavior. They saw in the breaking of the bread His wounds and concluded He was the one who had broken from the tomb. He showed forth His glory.

HISPANIC COMMUNITY Domingo 19 de Abril del 2026. (Tercera Semana de Pascua).

Hermanas y hermanos, los dos puntos de referencia, entonces, son la Resurrección y Pentecostés, que marcan no sólo el comienzo y el final del tiempo pascual sino el sentido de este mismo tiempo: porque Cristo ha resucitado el don del Espíritu Santo que lo ungió a él hoy nos unge a nosotros.

La primera lectura viene del discurso del apóstol Pedro en Pentecostés. Después de lo que hemos comentado, ya entendemos el estrecho vínculo que une a Pascua y Pentecostés y por tanto no nos extraña que Pedro levante su voz para decir con vigor maravilloso: "Conforme al plan previsto y sancionado por Dios, Jesús fue entregado, y ustedes por medio de los paganos lo clavaron en la cruz. Pero Dios lo resucitó rompiendo las ataduras de la muerte; no era posible que la muerte lo retuviera bajo su dominio" (Hechos 2,23-24).

Varias cosas debemos destacar en esas palabras que fueron capaces de traspasar como espadas los corazones de los oyentes. Lo primero es que la muerte de Cristo no es un accidente ni es sólo el fruto de confabulaciones humanas: hay un PLAN, hay una lógica, hay un propósito, en todo lo que le ha sucedido al Profeta de Nazareth y ese plan tiene la sanción divina porque su desenlace no es el que pretendían quienes se aliaron contra Jesús.

Lo segundo es que Pedro muestra la responsabilidad del pueblo. Si bien hay un plan y Dios saca bienes de los males eso no quita que nuestros males son auténticos males, y que precisamente por ello necesitábamos el bien auténtico de una salvación que no merecíamos.

Y lo tercero es que la gran derrotada ha sido la muerte, que no podía "retenerlo" bajo su dominio. Es maravilloso meditar en la indigestión que sufrió la muerte al tragarse como bocado al Autor de la vida. Sobre esto los Padres de la Iglesia nos han dejado páginas brillantes. Cristo derrotado es Cristo victorioso, porque en su derrota ha penetrado las cavernas de la muerte y desde el fondo de ella, como antes, como al principio desde las entrañas de la nada, ahora hace brotar un mundo nuevo. ¡Es Pascua, Aleluya!
