### **PASTOR’S REFLECTION**



When Jesus left his disciples, He promised them a new kind of relationship with him. It will not be like a memory of somebody whom people admired and loved but will gradually fade away that will eventually be replaced by person whom they see in flesh and blood. The gospel gives them the assurance that He will remain a real presence in their daily lives which will influence all that they do.

After Jesus leaves his disciples, He will have a new presence through his Advocate, the Holy Spirit. He is always with us and is very accessible. When we approach Him with love in our hearts, He tells us beautiful things. The Advocate awakens us to the truth, calls our attention to situations where it is lacking and clarifies the will of the Father. The Advocate is given to us in baptism, but he is more forcefully present whenever a community of disciples gathers around Jesus in a parish meeting or the Eucharist in which the word of God is central. He helps us recognize our responsibility to our family and community. He unites people not primarily to listen to Jesus’ word but to practice it. The Advocate is called in when our spirit is sagging to help us cope with unexpected challenges and to make us courageous in times of trial.

## HISPANIC COMMUNITY Domingo 10 de Mayo del 2026. (VI semana de Pascua).

Hermanas y hermanos, a medida que el tiempo pascual va llegando a su consumación los textos bíblicos que la Iglesia nos ofrece nos acercan más y más al misterio insondable y bello del Espíritu Santo. Es el tema central de la primera lectura y el evangelio. Entre tanto, la segunda lectura, del apóstol Pedro, continúa mostrándonos facetas de lo que significa tener "vida nueva" y nos da pistas sobre cómo llevar a la práctica la riqueza que hemos recibido con la fe y el bautismo. Cosa que es como otro modo de hablar del Espíritu Santo, si lo pensamos bien, porque todo lo que se diga de la vida cristiana es letra muerta o exigencia imposible, si no está Aquel que es "vida de nuestra vida" y "alma del alma," es decir, el Espíritu de Dios.

En el caso de hoy, Pedro nos exhorta a defender lo que creemos, pero más que con razones, las cuales son necesarias, con la mansedumbre, el respeto, incluso diríamos, el amor hacia aquel que nos interpela. Cosa que tiene mucho sentido: no se puede "defender" que uno es seguidor del Crucificado si no se tiene la disposición de participar en algo de su dolor y humillación. Por eso leímos hoy: "es mejor padecer haciendo el bien, si tal es la voluntad de Dios, que padecer haciendo el mal."

Volvamos a la primera lectura. Su punto central es la frase del final: "Pedro y Juan les impusieron sus manos a los samaritanos, y ellos recibieron el Espíritu Santo." Este gesto lo repite la Iglesia de manera formal, solemne y eficaz en el sacramento de la confirmación. Como sucesor de los apóstoles, el obispo implora sobre los ya bautizados la acción del Espíritu Santo, les impone las manos y ora sobre ellos.

Y también subrayemos adónde se dirigen los apóstoles: se trataba de "un pueblo de Samaría." Por el relato bien conocido de la mujer samaritana sabemos que había grande y mutua aversión entre judíos y samaritanos (véase Jn 4,9). Todas esas barreras, que eran culturales y religiosas, quedan pronto superadas cuando el amor divino toma posesión de los corazones. Inundados por la gracia que viene de lo alto, ya poco interesan los egoísmos de corto vuelo que tantas veces nos separan a los humanos. Así viene el Espíritu a reparar las brechas y sanar las heridas de división entre los hombres. La compasión de Cristo no tiene límites, por eso les anima con palabras blandas y da el remedio antes de que llegue la herida: "No los dejaré huérfanos," les dice. Y la manera de reparar esa orfandad es doble: primero, que se amen unos a otros; segundo, que reciban al Espíritu Santo, que los preservará en el amor y hará posible que el mismo Cristo se siga manifestando a ellos.

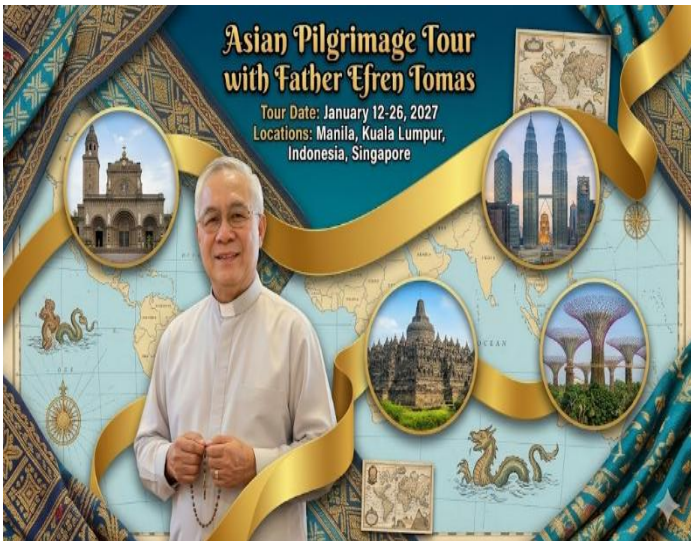
