PASTOR’S REFLECTION



Today’s Gospel tells us that when Jesus saw the crowds his heart was moved to pity for them, because they were harassed and dejected like a sheep without a shepherd. The twelve whom Jesus sent on his mission to the lost sheep of Israel were men who made themselves available. They showed a willingness to go and a disposition to work for Christ. Besides, the twelve Jesus sent on his mission, a composite group. They were made up of fishermen, a tax collector, a rationalist, a doubter and a traitor. All of them had a variety of temperaments, yet they volunteered for a mission to a crowd that Jesus pitied.

Availability for Christ’s mission did not necessarily imply capability for the work. Christ knew the limitations of the twelve, so before they could set out, He told them, “Do not turn your steps to pagan territory and do not enter any Samaritan town. Go therefore to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.” Why did He not send them to a pagan territory? We can only surmise that at this stage the twelve were not equipped with knowledge, skills, customs and techniques so necessary for a foreign mission.

HISPANIC COMMUNITY

**Domingo 14 de Junio del 2026.
(Semana XI del tiempo ordinario).**

Hermanas y hermanos, el tema de este domingo es la elección. Al elegirnos, Dios destruye nuestra soberbia, porque se muestra como Señor y como aquel que va adelante señalando el camino. Al elegirnos, Dios también pulveriza nuestra desesperación y hace nacer de modo maravilloso la esperanza. El Dios que elige se muestra como Providencia y como aquel que acepta nuestro pasado y nos abre su futuro

La primera lectura de hoy nos presenta al pueblo elegido. Dios ha creado este pueblo, lo ha sacado de donde era impensable: del robusto poder del altanero faraón, que se creía él mismo de raza divina. Dios eligiendo crea y creando elige. La elección es como una nueva creación que pone al elegido completamente en manos de su Creador. Con razón, pues, dice el Señor: "si me obedecen fielmente y guardan mi alianza, ustedes serán el pueblo de mi propiedad entre todos los pueblos." Así como los israelitas fueron salvados cuando fueron llamados y elegidos, así también nosotros hemos sido llamados y elegidos, y de esa manera, salvados en Cristo Jesús. Es lo que nos recuerda el apóstol san Pablo en la segunda lectura de hoy.

Si los israelitas fueron rescatados, elegidos y salvados de las manos del faraón, que era tenido como un todopoderoso, nosotros hemos sido rescatados, elegidos y salvados de otro poder que no por menos visible es menos real. Pero hemos sido llamados y elegidos. Cristo, especialmente en el misterio de la Cruz, es la presencia apremiante del amor divino. Pablo destaca la grandeza de ese amor: "Difícilmente habrá alguien que quiera morir por un justo. La prueba de que Dios nos ama está en que Cristo murió por nosotros, cuando aún éramos pecadores." Esas palabras conservan todo su valor y su fuerza hoy, como el primer día.

Los apóstoles son también "llamados" porque Dios nos está llamando a través de ellos. Ellos son los llamados vivos del corazón compasivo de Cristo. Si Cristo eligió apóstoles, ello no se debió sólo a una decisión táctica o práctica. Los textos del evangelio, como están dispuestos para la liturgia de la palabra de este domingo, enfatizan el enlace que hay entre la misericordia de Cristo, que ve la necesidad de operarios, y la resolución de Cristo de constituir como apóstoles suyos a estos Doce. Descubrimos así que el llamado particular al ministerio es algo que brota de las entrañas de piedad de Jesús. Cada sacerdote, en particular, y cada vocación, ha nacido ahí: en un corazón que inventa y crea siempre caminos nuevos para expresar su amor y para rescatar a sus pequeños y pobres.
