PASTOR’S REFLECTION



Today, as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, we are reminded that the Holy Eucharist has a variety of rich meanings. Some would prefer to see the Eucharist as a meal of thanksgiving. It is a celebration of God's good works in Jesus. Others would emphasize the Eucharistic celebration as a memorial. It is a way of remembering. Jesus himself commanded, "Do this in memory of me." Unlike remembering people when we browse over a picture album, Jesus becomes really present again in his Word and in the form of bread and wine. Others would call the Eucharist as a new covenant, a dialogue between God and his people mediated by the priest. In the Eucharist, we renew our pledge to be God's people, and he assures us of his abiding presence and protection.

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, let us examine our understanding and attitude towards this most august sacrament. We can discuss so many issues concerning the Eucharist, but we cannot tackle them all in one session. Suffice to say, however, that the Mass is not just a meal, or a fellowship or an entertainment presentation. Rather, the Mass is the one eternal sacrifice of Jesus that he offers to the heavenly Father in atonement for our sins.

HISPANIC COMMUNITY



Domingo 7 de Junio del 2026 (Fiesta del Cuerpo y Sangre de Jesucristo).

Hermanas y hermanos, Moisés, en la primera lectura, les recuerda a los hebreos que han conocido un alimento nuevo: el maná. Se han saciado con una comida que no conocieron sus padres y la fuerza que han recibido les ha permitido superar la escasez propia del desierto. En esto hay una enseñanza para nosotros.

Podemos comparar nuestra vida, o parte de ella, con ese desierto, no tanto por las incomodidades sino por la imposibilidad real que a veces encontramos para seguir adelante. Hay incomodidades en todas partes; lo propio, en cambio, del desierto es que se extiende delante de nosotros como una amenaza a la vida misma. Quien alguna vez haya sentido que se le extingue la vida, o el sentido de la vida o las ganas de seguir viviendo, entiende también el significado profundo de este desierto en el que Dios concedió un pan que era absolutamente nuevo para ellos.

Nosotros aplicamos ese relato al alimento eucarístico porque comprendemos que el impulso de amor que llevó a Cristo a dar su vida por nosotros es el mismo impulso que puede darnos vida cuando todo lo demás parece alejarse o extinguirse. Ejemplo real de esto encontramos particularmente en los mártires: enfrentados al momento espantoso de ser torturados hasta la muerte, muchos hallaron su fortaleza comiendo el Pan del Cielo: su último acto fue comulgar, y con ese viático, verdadero "alimento para el camino," cruzaron el puente y entraron a la vida que nadie puede arrebatarlos. Ahora bien, es un mismo Cristo quien nos alimenta a todos. Por eso es verdad que somos uno en él. Nuestra comunión es personal, porque Cristo se da a cada uno y a cada una, pero no es individual, porque no nos encierra ni nos aísla del resto de los hermanos y hermanas.

San Pablo nos recuerda hoy. "El pan que partimos, ¿no nos une a Cristo por medio de su cuerpo?" Llegar a descubrir que somos en Cristo es ya un paso pero hay que dar un paso más: descubrir que los demás están conmigo en Cristo. Este pensamiento es particularmente útil para santificar el afecto que tenemos por las personas que ya amamos, así como para vencer las antipatías o malos sentimientos que pudiéramos tener por alguien. Mirar a mi enemigo bañado en la misma Sangre que a mí me redime es seguramente un medio espiritual e incluso psicológico muy potente para superar divisiones y aversiones. Es cosa admirable ver que unas hogazas de pan alimentan a una multitud pero es más admirable ver que un mismo Cristo alimenta a todos los creyentes. Es maravilloso ver que comieron cerca de cinco mil familias pero es mucho más grande ver que la familia de Dios se sienta alrededor del altar y recibe de allí su alimento. Es más grande que se entregue a si mismo en la Eucaristía.
