PASTOR'S REFLECTION



"...And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because he is a disciple... he will surely not lose his reward." (Mt 10:42)

The last sentence of the gospel is beautiful. Just giving a cup of cold water to one of the little ones is enough to be given one's reward. It assures all of us that we can receive our reward. Not great learnings, not sensational achievements, not heroic acts nor high positions are needed to be Jesus' disciple. Only the ordinary daily acts of caring for the little ones, whether these be the weak in faith and love, the poor or underserving our attention are needed. Nobody is too small at the receiving end; nothing is too small at the giving end.

Jesus' words give hope to all of us who have so little to offer, for we can all receive our reward. It is something we can do in our everyday lives. The small things that we do every day done with much love makes it big before God's eyes. People's happiness does not usually depend on unusual happenings or extraordinary feats but on the daily exchange of little acts of kindness and generosity with the people near us. If we do so, our baptism will not create enemies but people who also accept Jesus' word with joy.

HISPANIC COMMUNITY
Domingo 28 de Junio del 2026. (Semana XIII del tiempo ordinario).

Hermanas y hermanos, a veces nos preguntamos cómo se puede practicar hoy esta hospitalidad. Por una parte, y por lo menos en muchos países y ciudades, el menesteroso puede contar con algún tipo de soporte mínimo, a lo menos algo que le impida morir de sed, hambre o frío. Por otra parte, las condiciones de muchos de los mendigos actuales es diferente de la de sus antecesores en tiempos bíblicos o en culturas distintas. Hay mendigos adictos a las drogas, alcohólicos irredentos, trastornados mentales, delincuentes en fuga, o simplemente gente que juega con la compasión de otros para buscar dinero u otras cosas. Estos temores, unidos al egoísmo e individualismo típicos de las ciudades, hacen que no encontremos caminos fáciles para la hospitalidad.

Hay cosas que pueden hacerse, sin embargo. En un país como Irlanda hay albergues para mendigos y hay personas que donan de su tiempo para ayudara los que no tienen un techo, por ejemplo, sirviéndoles los alimentos. Lo hacen de manera voluntaria y caritativa, sin poner en peligro sus vidas ni sus propios hogares. En algunos lugares de Colombia han surgido iniciativas de dar algo de alimento a los habitantes de las calles. Puede parecer poco, dar simplemente un tazón de sopa caliente, pero para centenares de personas, ese es el único gesto de amor que reciben cada semana durante años.

Decíamos que en los lugares y tiempos de los desiertos no recibir al peregrino equivalía a condenarlo a muerte. Otro tanto se puede decir desde el punto de vista emocional. Mucha gente tiene buena provisión de alimento y bebida, e incluso comodidades materiales, pero no tiene la sensación de importarle a nadie. Esos que se arrojan al abrazo de la muerte quizá estuvieron esperando demasiado tiempo que alguien les diera un abrazo de vida.

Tanto la primera lectura como el evangelio hacen énfasis en un punto adicional. No se habla sólo de hospitalidad sino de recibir "a un hombre de Dios," según la lectura del Segundo Libro de los Reyes, o recibir "a un profeta porque es profeta," según las palabras de Cristo en el evangelio. Esa expresión que usa Nuestro Señor es particularmente significativa. Recibir al profeta "porque es profeta" es aceptar su profecía, es decir, es acoger al

Dios que habla a través de un instrumento que en sí mismo es imperfecto. La hospitalidad aquí ya no es sólo caridad sino sobre todo fe: una fe que hace que, al recibir al mensajero de Dios, sea Dios mismos quien nos reciba. Feliz y bendecida semana.
