PASTOR'S REFLECTION



The Parable of the Sower and the seed is one of the most popular parables of Jesus portraying the Kingdom of God using something familiar and common to the people's lives during the time of Christ. It was addressed to a large crowd that came to hear Jesus. It highlights the great patience of God in Jesus. Jesus went out to sow the seed and for almost 2,000 years it has been scattered all over the world. We have many lay leaders, catechists and ordinary people who believe in the power of the seed and keep sowing it. Like Jesus, they experience that the field is covered by rocks and weeds, but they go on for they also see the seed taking root and bearing fruit.

The Parable of the Sower tells us not to lose courage, but to keep sowing the seed generously even if some of it is wasted on people who do not care, some of it are nice in our face but are indifferent to our needs, some would express eagerness to support us, but are dragged along in no time by their own worries and preoccupations. We don't realize it but much of the seed we sow, however, does grow and bear fruit. God tirelessly goes about his task of sharing His goodness, no matter what the result is, no matter how futile and hostile are the receivers.

HISPANIC COMMUNITY

Domingo 12 de Julio del 2026. (Semana XV del tiempo ordinario).

Hermanas y hermanos, la primera lectura de hoy compara a la Palabra de Dios con la lluvia; el evangelio la relaciona con la semilla. El mundo de la agricultura nos ayudará hoy a entender el misterio maravilloso que acontece cuando Dios habla y alguien escucha. No es causalidad esta comparación. El campo es el lugar donde brota la vida; una vida que no vemos pero que sí necesitamos; una vida que hace posible nuestra propia vida. Y aunque comprendemos en parte lo que sucede entre la tierra, la semilla y el agua, un corazón atento siempre sabe maravillarse de gozo cuando aparece la espiga. La primera lectura enfatiza la eficacia, es decir, el poder que hay en la Palabra de Dios.

¿Por qué dice Dios que la palabra "vuelve" a él? Esto no es obvio al principio. Uno no habla para que le devuelvan lo que uno ha dicho. En esto hay un misterio más, muy bello, que uno puede percibir con el verbo "benedicir." Dios nos bendice y nosotros bendecimos a Dios. O mejor: nosotros bendecimos porque hemos sido bendecidos. Bendecir viene de "decir bien," esto es: "decir la palabra justa, bella, sabia, apropiada. Dios nos bendijo porque nos dio la Palabra que salva; nosotros le bendecimos porque somos su pueblo adquirido, la raza que él ha salvado. Así como las gotas de lluvia parece que se perdieran, cayendo en desorden por todas partes, así la siembra tradicional entre los campesinos del pueblo de Jesús; ellos sembraban haciendo llover la vida sobre la tierra. Era un método poco práctico en que mucho se desperdiciaba. La parábola de hoy nos recuerda eso: que mucho se desperdiciaba.

Nuestro Dios es un-Dios que desperdicia. Suena casi a herejía pero en realidad lo decimos con máximo respeto y con inmensa admiración. En el plano puramente terrenal, ¿quiénes son los que desperdician sino los que tienen en

abundancia? Los muy ricos organizan fiestas y banquetes donde mucho se desperdicia, y pareciera que no les importara si se pierde mucho licor o comida. Así muestran que son verdaderamente ricos.

Nuestro Dios es auténticamente rico y su riqueza no es engañosa. Es rico en amor, es rico en perdón, es rico en justicia y en sabiduría. Hace hermosos amaneceres que ningún pintor podría pintar... y deja que se "desperdicien" sin que nadie los contemple. Inventa millones y millones de galaxias que al parecer nadie ha visto ni podrá ver. Dios se da el "lujo" de derrochar su amor y de esparcir a placer su Palabra. Mucho parece perderse, mucho de hecho se pierde, pero el resultado no engaña: la cosecha será abundante. Feliz y bendecida semana.

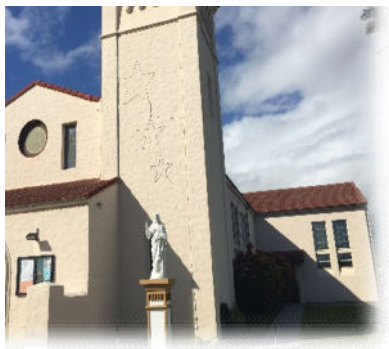
